

Grammatical Structures

Examples

-
- **simple present tense** → *Jeremy **works** hard.*
 - **present continuous tense** → *Kate **is looking for** her purse*
 - **can/cannot** → *He **can** swim.*
 - **should/need to** → *You **should** finish your food.*
 - **must/must not** → *You **must not** smoke here.*
 - **be going to, will** → *I **am going to** watch a movie tonight.*
 - **simple past tense** → *They **stayed** at a hotel last night.*
 - **common adjectives** → *It was a **fantastic** movie!*
 - **common adverbs** → *The weather was **extremely** cold.*
 - **common prepositions** → *They live **in** London.*
 - **some, few, many, much** → *She has **many** friends.*
 - **and, but, or** → *Dorothy **and** her friends are playing outside.*
 - **very, so, too** → *I am **so** scared!*
 - **before, after, when** → *I called him **after** I finished my work.*
 - **because, so** → *They played well **so** they won.*
 - **adverbs of manner** → *He speaks English **fluently**.*
 - **simple gerunds and infinitives** → *Mike enjoys **meeting** new people.*
 - **imperative** → ***Sit down!***
